Director's Notes

It's my great pleasure to bring to you this humble experience of Scorched! The beautifully written script by Wajdi Mouawad, translated by Linda Gaboriau, will take you on a journey of unravelling secrets of the past and discovering roots.

Presenting on stage political theatre written or created by racialized Canadian artists is integral to my work. It's unfortunate to say that after many years, the story is still relevant with what is still happening in the region of Lebanon, Palestine and Syria.

In this production of Scorched, I'm focusing on how war keeps us stuck in cycles of loss of identity, generational trauma, and anger. The effects of war are not only there while it's happening. The war echoes are felt ahead of time and its remnants of displacement and destruction stay for many generations after. I'm talking specifically about the war that is rooted in colonization and the desire to conquer. The colonization that created borders and divided people based on religion, sect, and class.

In the rehearsal process, I have used some of my learnings of MT Space's methodology of devised physical theatre, developed by the late founder, Majdi Bou-Matar, with a focus on the physicality while centralizing the actors' lived experience.

I hope you get a sense of what violent wars and colonization are capable of doing, and the unbearable ugly results and effects they have on people and land. I encourage you to leave the theatre hall today with thoughts on your connection and roots with the land that shape how you ground yourself and resist all forms of colonialism. Scorched is a reminder that relationship building and bridging with our loved ones require effort and time. It's an investment and belief in the power of the collective rather than escaping to individualism.

Scorched is not only a play to watch, it's a conversation starter. Let us continue to keep the important difficult conversations going beyond the theatre doors. The opportunity to bring Scorched to life through KWLT is invaluable to me at this stage of my career as an emerging director. I would like to thank every person who helped in bringing this production to life. Without you, we couldn't have made it.

Production Notes

"Incendies" was first presented in France, on March 14, 2003, at l'Hexagone Scène Nationale de Meylan, and subsequently in Québec, on May 23, 2003, at Théâtre de Quat'sous during the tenth edition of the Festival de théâtre des Amériques. The production was directed by Wajdi Mouawad.

"Scorched", the English-language adaptation of "Incendies", was made possible through the assistance of the National Arts Centre (Ottawa) and with the financial support of the Government of Canada through the Interdepartmental Partnership with the Official Languages Communities (ipolc), an initiative of the Department of Canadian Heritage. "Scorched" was first presented in a staged reading at The Old Vic Theatre in London, as part of "4play Canada," a showcase event co-presented by the National Arts Centre (Ottawa) and the Canadian High Commission (London uk). The reading was directed by Braham Murray, Artistic Director of the Royal Exchange Theatre Manchester.

"Scorched" is produced by permission of the author and Simard Agence Artistique.

Playwright Waidi Mouawad

Wajdi Mouawad (author of Scorched, Tideline, Forests, Heavens, among others) has established himself as a uniquely original player on the contemporary theatre scene. His plays have been translated in more than twenty languages and presented all over the world. In all his work, from his own plays and adaptations, from the productions he has directed to novels he wrote, Wajdi Mouawad expresses the conviction that "art bears witness to human existence through the prism of beauty." He is recipient of numerous awards and honors for his work. He is currently Director of La Colline—théâtre national in Paris.

Translator Linda Gaboriau

Linda Gaboriau is a literary translator and dramaturg based in Montreal. She has specialized in translating drama and has translated more than 120 plays, including the works of some of Québec's most prominent playwrights. Her translations have been published and widely produced across Canada and abroad. Her work has garnered many awards, including the Governor General's Award for Translation in 1996 and again in 2010 for Forests.
